The SWC is pleased to have County Commissioner Henry Dean speak at our general meeting on October 14th. With vast experience in



state and local government, and especially in water related issues, Henry will give us an overview of the state of our county and our local area.

To be more specific, Commissioner Dean will discuss the state of St. Johns county, the strategic plan for the future, the

challenges of controlling growth, and the beach renourishment project.

As Commissioner since 2016, and involved in Florida government since 1974, Dean has been active in conservation, especially water management. He established the first minimum flows and levels in Florida for the Wekiva River System. He has given special attention to springs protection, led efforts to acquire critical buffers to benefit Silver Springs and Silver Glen Springs, and assisted with restoring more than 200,000 acres of marsh along the St. Johns River.

Henry Dean, a long-time resident of St. Johns county, lives in St. Augustine Beach with his wife and four children.

While it's still hot and humid. calendars our tell us that Fall is here. Our topic this month "Something is that triggers a Fall memory"...





First Day of School By Sara-Ann Gomez

Well, most of you know that I have no real memories prior to age 9, but my family has told this story so many times that I feel like I remember it.

We lived in a pretty isolated neighborhood of about 7 streets that criss-crossed, with the area surrounded by a busy US 1 on one end, a major four lane street on the other, and dead ends every where else. Our house was just two blocks from the school, which was across the busy 4 lane street and up on a big grassy hill. You could either climb up the stairs or walk up a long hilly driveway.



My mom walked me down, crossed at the traffic light and up the stairs into the front door on the first day of kindergarten and right to the door of my classroom (all classrooms had two doors). She didn't come in the door but watched me walk in and assumed I went to my seat. We had been a couple of days before and I had met my teacher. Well, she left and went back the same way we came. I, on the other hand, went into the classroom, out the other door and then the back door of the school, down the driveway, crossed that big street in the middle and through several back yards and beat my mother home. She found me sitting on the back porch steps. I said I wanted nothing to do with school, nope not going. She let me stay home that day. Well, we tried again the next day and same thing. This went on for the whole week.

Of course, my mother was in touch with the school and now the school psychologist suggested that I was just too attached to my mother and they needed to think of some separation ideas. My mother said I could go to my favorite Aunt's every weekend and maybe that would help. Agreed, the school said. So, on Friday afternoon, my mother took me on the little red bus which traveled through town to my aunt's on the other side of town. My Aunt adored me and I adored her. She was much older than my mother and had three grown boys who shared a room in the attic of this house. For me, they were uncles so I knew they loved me. My aunt and uncle lived on the first floor and a tenant lived on the second floor. The first weekend was tons of fun with all of them and on Sunday, my mom and dad came to get me.

This arrangement went on for several weekends, and while I called my mother on the phone all weekend, in between making homemade bread with my aunt, or bike riding with my uncles (cousins), I still wasn't ready to go to kindergarten and stay there until about the fifth week of school, they tell me. After that I guess I figured it was okay for during the week as long as on Friday, my mother put me on the little red bus that took me across town all by myself (the bus driver was a cousin) and dropped me right in front of my aunt's house.
